New Year's day, people hold communal events wishing for the well-being of the family and the communities throughout the year. One is a ceremonial rite to honor one's deceased ancestors called charye, and the other is respectful deep bowing to living elders called sebae. In response to the sebae, the elders deliver wishful words, deokdam for harmony and wellness to the younger ones. In order to bring good fortune while expelling evil, symbolic items like bokjori (fortune strainer) and seahwa (New Year's painting) are decorated in the house. To celebrate the day, all family members wear new clothes, seolbim and have representative traditional winter holiday food, ttookguk (soup with sliced rice cake). Other various celebrations also take place including playing seasonal games such as yutnori (board game playing with yut), and yeonnalligi (kite flying)

Seol (Korean Lunar New Year) is a holiday which marks the first day of the Korean Lunar Calendar. On the morning of
